From the Dean's desk...

It has been another full and exciting year with the highlight surely being the Cathedral nave dinner in October. Those who had not been to the Cathedral before were simply amazed by the stunning appearance of the nave, and Lynne Bax and the Cathedral team, under Colin Tolhurst did us proud! All the feedback has been extremely positive.

We are indebted to our Royal patron, Her Royal Highness, the Countess of Wessex for being our honoured guest, to members of the Cathedral choir for performing excerpts from James Taylor's Magnificat, specially written for the occasion and to Jools Holland for sending us home with a spring in our step. We also very grateful to Mike Aiken, the Chairman of the Cathedral Trust and to MEMS Power Generation for their generous sponsorship of the evening.

Joss Croft, the Chair of the Cathedral Trust's Development Committee, spoke about the Cathedral's most pressing priorities and the urgent need to raise £240,000 for immediate repairs to a Bath stone pinnacle above the Cathedral Library. From a casual glance at ground level there is nothing obviously wrong, but the Cathedral surveyor has identified this structure as being at risk of collapse. If it did, it would severely damage the roof of the 12th century library, which has just been reopened to great acclaim as part of the Hidden Treasures, Fresh Expressions project.

It was announced on the evening that we have received a remarkable pledge of £100,000 towards this project with a condition that we raise the balance before the end of next March. Work is underway in applying to trusts and foundations, but time is very short. If you have already contributed to this project we are most grateful. Donations can be made by direct bank transfer or by cheque – please contact the Development office for details. I'm delighted to announce that we raised £25K on the night.

As we move into Advent and prepare for Christmas I look forward to seeing you at some festive event and give thanks that Rochester Cathedral holds a special places in the hearts of so many.


Rochester Cathedral Trust Christmas Cards
